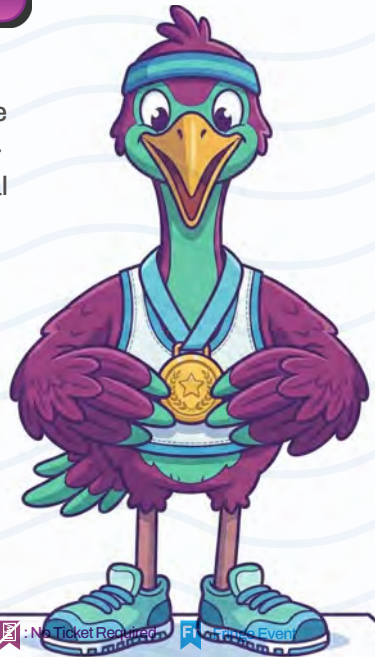

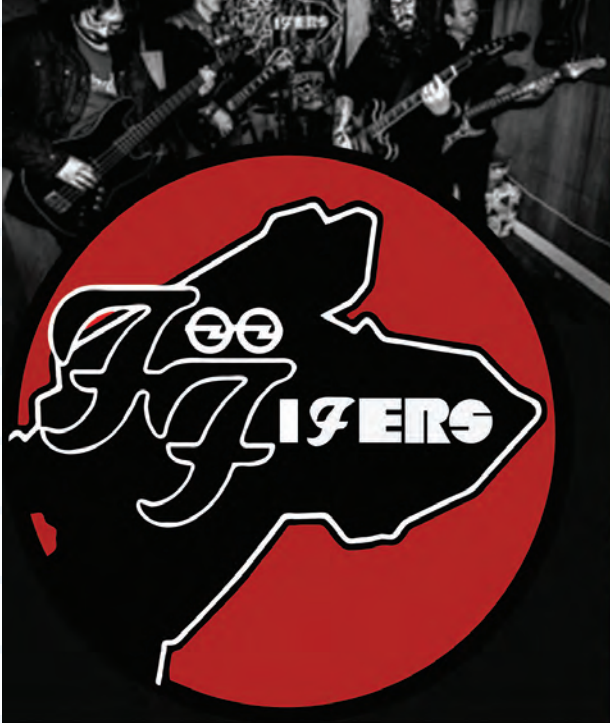

His most recent show Deaf Com One did a 60-date tour in the UK, Australia and New Zealand. Ray is also a regular host of the hit Radio Scotland show Off the Ball.

David Eagle is a member of three-time BBC Radio 2 Folk Award winning band The Young'uns. In 2018 he branched out into stand up and is now a Radio 4 regular, with his own stand-up series 'See No Eagle' and multiple appearances on The Now Show. He has won numerous awards including The Spirit Of The Fringe Award at 2024's Edinburgh Fringe Festival and his debut solo show, The Eagle Is Candid, won Best Variety Show at Leicester Comedy Festival.

The evening will be compered by award-winning Scottish comedian **Susan Morrison**. Susan has been an MC at The Stand Comedy club since the day it opened, and she has taken to the stage in clubs from Bournemouth to Berlin. She is a writer, broadcaster and comedian!

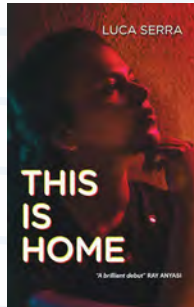

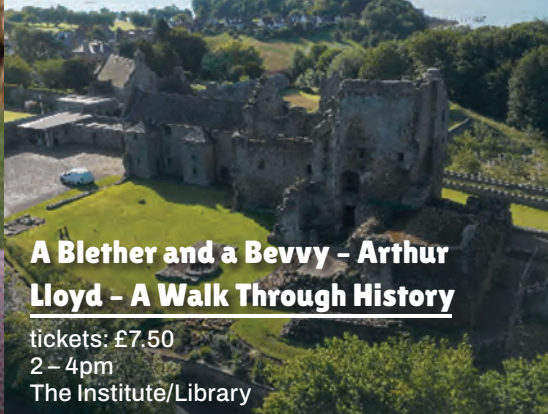

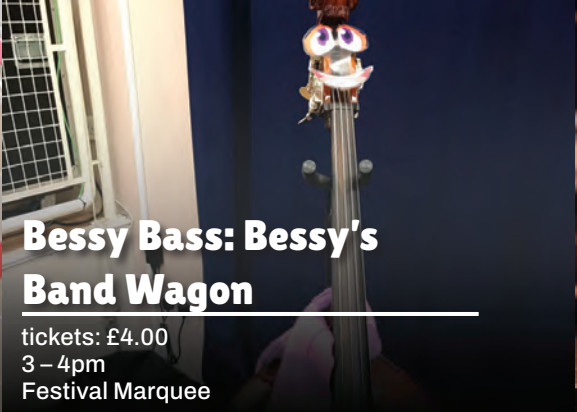
